"My dream is to make a difference by assisting learners to reach their full potential in life. Education has been my passion from primary school days. Thinking back, I used to play school with my friends and I of course always took on the role as the teacher. I knew that this was my calling and that I would be a teacher one day." Emsie has had a long career in teaching and is a true educationalist at heart. She is currently working as a remedial therapist helping learners overcome barriers to learning. After extensive research she implemented a school-based programme focused on assisting learners to overcome barriers in Afrikaans, English and mathematics. The programme is aimed at learners from grade one to nine. "I believe the children of today will be the

leaders of tomorrow, and that is why it is so important we teach our children to master the art of effective study and exam techniques. Because children are more likely to learn in a more effective way once they use effective learning techniques, you will find they will develop a love for learning that can last a lifetime.

"I recently presented this course with 20 learners at a local school. It was one of the most blessed days I have ever experienced in my life. After the workshop each learner came to me and hugged me and told me how I opened doors for them they did not know existed. I know that I empowered them with skills that are going to last a lifetime! Money cannot buy this warm feeling of recognition and satisfaction."

Besides her busy career, Emsie enjoys travel. "The world is a book, and those who

do not travelling only read a page, I would like to read the whole book. I get energy from travel, and as soon as I have returned from a trip all the new, innovative ideas start flowing in.

"I like to spend quiet times with the Lord and trust Him to guide me and use me as an instrument in His hands and to apply the talents that He gave me to the best of my ability. I want to move out of my comfort zone at all times, because I know that is where you grow and make a difference!"

He is my rock that keeps me balanced. We have two sons, Ruan (22) a fifth year medical student at Wits University, next year he will qualify as a medical doctor. I am so fortunate that they both study from home and I still see them every day, although they have hectic schedules.
